TERMS AND GUIDELINES

- **Eligibility:** All Colorado high school and college students are eligible to participate in the contest with the exception listed in “Ineligibility” below.
- **Content:** Posters will be judged for originality, content, style and educational value. The focus of the poster should be on the topic of deterring young people from engaging in underage gambling and/or the ramifications associated with underage gambling. A combined message about underage and problem gambling is encouraged.
- **Entry Requirements:** The poster entry must be accompanied by an essay (minimum one page, double-spaced) discussing the topic of underage gambling as noted in “Content” above.
- **Application:** The poster and essay must also be accompanied by a “21 is a Must” 2012 Scholarship Application which can be obtained at www.problemgamblingcolorado.org
- **Submission Deadline:** The poster entry, completed application and other required documentation outlined above must be submitted to the Problem Gambling Coalition of Colorado, 11757 West Ken Caryl Ave., #F-181, Littleton, CO 80127 by **January 31, 2012.**
- **Notice to Winners:** Notification to the authors of the winning posters will be announced by March 1, 2012. The Prizes will be awarded by March 15, 2012 except as outlined in “Scholarship Check Distribution” below.
- **Ineligibility:** No one may serve as a scholarship judge if a family member has submitted an entry.
- **Scholarship Check Distribution:** The “21 is a Must” scholarship checks will be issued jointly to the winning author and to an accredited school of higher education including colleges, universities, and vocational/technical schools located within the United States, which the winning student is, or will be attending. If a winning student has not chosen a school of higher education when the scholarship check is scheduled for distribution, the Problem Gambling Coalition of Colorado will hold the winnings (or the pro rata amount as the case may be) in escrow until the student is ready to attend school. The proceeds can be held no longer than two years. After four years, the proceeds will be donated to a charitable agency or used for a charitable purpose (including other “21 is a Must” scholarships) if the funds have not been used by that time.
